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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Kinwat Shikshan Sanstha's, Baliram Patil Arts, Commerce and Science College was established in the year 1972 and is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded (MS). It is the only college in the town having Arts, Commerce and Science stream at UG level. All the programs are directed towards the realisation of our vision mission and achieving our objectives in keeping with the values of our college. It has competent and experienced staff in teaching departments, well equipped and specious laboratories, a computer department, rich central and departmental libraries supported by spacious reading rooms, beautiful campus, and girls' hostels, well developed botanical garden and playgrounds. It aims to provide quality education to the students come from all walks of life. The institution feels proud of being serving the rural and tribal masses educationally and socially, thus bringing light into their lives and contributing in the national development through strengthening its human resource. The Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded (SRTMU) has awarded Best College Magazine Award to the annual magazine of the college 'UNMESH' in A.Y-2021-22 and department of computer science has been sanctioned RGSTC -Minor research project.

In January 2004, the institute had successfully faced the first cycle of NAAC with 'C++' grade and In September 2017, the college went for its second cycle and NAAC awarded B+ grade to the college with 2.57 CGPA. Institute participated in NIRF.

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1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The institute is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded adopts the syllabi prescribed by the university. However, the institute develops innovative and creative methods by using ICT tools for the effective delivery of the curriculum. All these tools have been extensively used during the period of the covid-19 pandemic. The identified gaps in the curriculum are bridged by value-added programmes and

life skills programmes. The faculty members are also encouraged to attend and participate in orientation programmes/activities organized by the university. The institute programmes have Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) implemented with elective subjects. However, indirectly through the faculty of our college who are elected as BOS members, the college registers its say on curriculum planning, designing, implementation and development.

The faculty keeps themselves abreast of all emerging trends in their respective subjects by attending workshops and publishing research papers in national, international, state level journals. Our faculty actively register their participations in workshops to keep themselves updated on restructured syllabus and to contribute their expertise in the same. In order to hone their professional skill, the college motivates and relieves its faculty to attend faculty development programmes such as refresher, orientation and short term course.

The College regularly collects feedback on curriculum and about teachers from students, teachers and alumni. The collected feedback is analysed, presented in IQAC/CDC meetings, relevant action is taken.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The admission process of the institution is in accordance with the university guidelines. The institute admits students from various reserved categories as per the reservation policies of the competent authority. The college being a tribal and rural one, 51 % of our students are SC/ST/OBC/Minority and 42 % of our students are female which is in line with the University and state government policy. The institute caters to the learning needs of students of different backgrounds and abilities. Special efforts are taken to identify slow and advanced learners on the basis of their semester examination marks and appropriate measures are taken to satisfy their learning needs accordingly.

The institution has proficient and devoted faculty members from diverse backgrounds. The institution utilizes student-centric methods and experimental learning approaches. The teachers adopt ICT tools and e-resources to enrich the learning experiences of the students. The curriculum has well defined POs, PSOs and Cos, which are displayed on college website which is regularly updated.

The institution ensures good performance from students through outcome-based education by calculating attainment levels of outcomes. The institute has adopted Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) mechanism prescribed by the university to achieve academic excellence. The mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust, covering all the learning domains. Examination-related grievances are addressed at the institute as well as the university level in a well-defined, time-bound, and efficient manner. The institution adheres to the academic calendar and teaching plan for effective delivery of the curriculum.

The testimony of this is the higher qualification degrees possessed by them & the awards and honours conferred from time to time. The college conducts workshop/seminars on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) periodically.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The institute puts in sincere efforts to promote a research culture amongst the faculty and students by motivating and encouraging them to publish their work in reputed journals and conferences. The institute organizes various seminars and guest lectures to upgrade the knowledge of faculty and students. Though the college is located in tribal and rural area, it has a vibrant research culture. Sticking up to its commitment,

Kinwat Shikshan Sanstha has allotted 3.16 acres of its land to the affiliating university to set up tribal research centre which will help in enhanced studies on tribal lives, schemes, policies, socio- economic and socio-cultural background of the tribal lives and enabling them to lead a dignified life. At present, out of 16 faculty members, 09 are Ph.D., 03 are M.Phil. and 04 are SET/ NET. 04 faculty member are engaged in their doctoral programmes, 06 faculty members are recognized research supervisors in subjects like Botany, Marathi, English, Hindi and commerce. To date, the college has to its credit 07 MRPS completed, 01 ongoing.

In the area of consultancy, the college offers its expert service on water testing, blood group testing free of cost. Being conscious of one's social responsibilities and the debt we owe to the society, our faculty and students are actively engaged in eradicating social evils like caste, creed, sex, poverty , illiteracy, superstition through organizing and participating in programmes with the help of NSS, NCC cultural wing of our college and various external agencies like ANIS. National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), Cultural Committee, etc. have already been established in the institute to provide a platform for various extension activities. Activities such as tree plantation, blood donation, disaster management, etc. are regularly organized and some of them have also received awards/appreciation from renowned agencies at the national, state-level, and surrounding areas.

The institute organizes seminars/guest lectures to promote interaction between industries and the institution and MoUs are also signed with industries/ corporate houses/ firms to develop activities allied with industries.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The institution has an adequate infrastructure with well-equipped classrooms, laboratories, a library, and a seminar hall as per the requirement of the affiliating university. Kinwat Shikshan Sanstha, Baliram Patil college has a total area of 20 acres, of which 3.16 acres is allotted to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University for the purpose of building Tribal Research Centre in the name of our founder president late Shri Uttamraoji Rathod. The college has a separate administrative wing with all the necessary facilities and required technology. It has 23 classrooms with requisite furniture and teaching learning resources. Apart from it, we have spacious, physics lab, zoology lab, chemistry lab, maths lab, botany lab and zoology research centre with ICT facility and needed equipment's. A spacious computer lab with 20 systems is available with us. Internet, Wi-Fi facility is available for the office and almost all the departments in our college. A common waiting room for the girl students with the necessary facilities is one of the important infrastructural features of our college.

The institution has its own exclusive large playground for various outdoor games like Cricket, Volleyball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho. A dedicated indoor complex is also available for indoor games like a wooden court of Badminton, Carom & Chess. The institution promotes the students to participate in Intercollegiate, Intra-collegiate, University, State, and National level sports competitions every year.

Automation of library using the SOUL2.0, use of e-journals and books, more than 44,404 books in the library enable students to acquire information, knowledge and skills required for their programs. We have OPAC system in our library along with N-List. The library operates through the library advisory committee which includes all the stakeholders. The committee takes care of library budget for the purchase of books & journals and resolving grievances pertaining to library. The institute has a well-defined maintenance procedure to take care of the maintenance of infrastructure including laboratories, classrooms, and student support facilities.

The upkeep and maintenance of infrastructure and other services is taken care of by non-teaching staff and hired technicians.

Student Support and Progression

The Institute continuously strives to provide excellent mechanisms for the support & progression of students. The students are benefitted from scholarships and free-ship schemes provided by the government.

The institute provides capability enhancement and development programs such as guidance for competitive examinations, soft skills development, personal counselling, yoga/meditation, and remedial coaching for students. Student grievances are addressed through committees such as Grievance Redressal, Anti-Ragging, & Women's Grievances Cell, or Anti-sexual Harassment Cell. Institute organizes various training programs. The Students have their representation on various bodies like IQAC, CDC, Library committee, Anti-ragging Committee, NSS, NCC, and Sports etc.

The students actively participate in sports/cultural activities and competitions organized at the inter-college and intra-college levels. The institute also maintains strong and healthy interactions with alumni through alumni meets organized every year. The student's exhibit their creative talent through publishing wall papers on various occasions and writing for the annual college magazine "**UNMESH**". To inculcate professional and life skills along with moral and ethical values, the college organizes industrial and study tours to places of historical, cultural and scientific importance. The college takes every possible care to ensure students comfortable academic journey in the campus and organize activities ensuring all round development of the students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The decisions and policies of the management are implemented through the Principal and the coordinators of various committees. The faculty members and students have representation on decision-making committees. The strategic plan is prepared and its effective implementation is carried out for the attainment of the vision and mission of the institute.

An E-governance system is used for planning and development, administration, finance, student admission, and examination. Administration takes care of key attributes such as budgetary provisions, financial support, and Infrastructure development for the smooth functioning of the institute as well as for the empowerment of the faculty and nonteaching staff.

The institute has a performance appraisal system to judge the performance of teaching and non-teaching staff members. The Co-curricular and Extracurricular activities are carried out through various college level committees constituted for the purpose. The audit is done by the statutory auditors and also by the Govt. auditors at regular intervals.

The Principal implements the action plan to improve the quality of the teaching-learning process of the institute as per the recommendations of the IQAC cell. The IQAC cell is functional and regular meetings are held, audits are done and NAAC supporting works are carried out.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The institute has to provide equal opportunity to all the employees and students in matters related to gender

sensitivity with facilities such as safety, security, counselling, and separate common rooms for the boys and girls. The institution ensures that boys and girls work together in academic, cultural, sports, and other activities. The College implemented security and safety measures such as CCTV cameras and 24 hours security personnel's in the campus. For girls a separate common room facility is available on the campus, which comprises First Aid Box and Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine and bedding facility for sick person. However, the institution takes care of gender sensitivity to ensure the safety and security of female students.

The institution has an institutionalized internal complaints committee for prevention, prohibition, and redressal of sexual harassment of employees and students. The Institute takes adequate measures to organize the programs related to gender equity promotion, social responsibilities, celebrate national festivals, and birth/death anniversaries of great personalities. College conducts programs to celebrate national and international commemorative days, events and festivals regularly.

The institute promotes the use of renewable energy (Solar water system is made available in hostel) and LED bulbs. Solid, liquid, bio-medical, and e-waste management processes are well-structured. Institute has a rainwater harvesting mechanism and harvested water is used for maintaining the green initiatives of the institute. Institute follows green practices such as tree plantation, a plastic-free campus, and partial paperless work to promote environmental consciousness and sustainability.

The college conducts a green audit, energy audit. The College observes No Vehicle Day and restricted entry to vehicles. The two best practices of the college chosen out of the several quality initiatives during the Cycle 3 assessment Period are: 'Blood Donation' and the second one is - 'No Vehicle Day'. Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Parent university has initiated several measures to bring equity, efficiency and excellence in the Higher Education System. The CBCS Pattern provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill based courses. Institute also provide some value added courses for all student of the institute from different branches like Arts, Commerce and Science.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	No ABC credit system will be maintained for students or teachers for this assessment period. however, the institution keeps academic bank of credit records as per parent university guidelines for

	the following academic year. We encourage all our students to use ABC Portal and DiGiLocker. And also university allows Credit Transfer for SWAYAM or MOOCs. This is a great opportunity to our students if credits awarded to a student for one program from an institution may be transferred or redeemed by another institute. We welcome it for it allows student to study at their own pace and offers transparency in curriculum delivery.
3. Skill development:	Institute offers skill development short term certificate courses, which are conducted during their classes or on weekends, to help students stand apart from the rest in the career market. These courses are conducted by professionals and industry experts and contribute to knowledge and skills of the entire cohort, and not just any one student.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The majority of the arts faculty subjects are taught and learned in local and national languages like Hindi and Marathi. The institution teaches several subjects in Indian language. The institution offers Marathi-language instruction in the faculty of commerce. The institute provided a summary of science topics in Marathi or Hindi language. Future degree programmes will run primarily in Indian language in accordance with U.G.C. and parent university guidelines.

Classrooms:

There are 30 classrooms have the capacity of 1000 students, 06 are laboratories, 04 rooms for library, , 01 ICT halls, and 14 department offices in the college. The classrooms are provided with facilities like fan, tube-lights, benches and other required facilities.

Seminar Hall (HallNo-03, 04)

Provision is made for one well-equipped Seminar room, which is also used as Class Room. The Hall has the seating capacity of 200 students. The undergraduate seminars are held in seminar or in department itself.

Laboratories:

All the departments of Science and Social Sciences have attached 06 laboratories.

- **Physics Labs :** Department of physics is well equipped with Cathod Ray Tube(CRO), Flywheel, Pendulum, Lees disk, Spectrometer, Y-by Koeings Method, Fergusion Apparatus, Newtons ring apparatus etc.
- **Chemistry Labs:** The department of chemistry has a laboratory with Conductivity Meter, Digital Balance, potentiometer, colorimeter, microwave oven, etc.
- **Botany Lab:** The department of botany is well equipped with Binocular, a research microscope with laminar airflow system, tissue culture chamber, Spectrometer, Digital PH meter, Soil testing Kit, Incubator, Inoculation Chamber, Tilak Air Sample, etc.
- **Zoology Lab:** Department of zoology has oven, incubator, Elicomake digital colorimeter, Digital Water Analysis, Monocular Microscope, Binacular Research microscope, Digital balance, etc.
- **Computer Lab:** Department of Computer Science is well equipped with one laptop, printer and 20 Computer Systems
- **Mathematics Lab:** Department of Mathematics is well equipped with computers MATLAB software and internet connection

ICT and Other Equipment:

There are well-equipped seminar cum ICT halls. Subject wise time table for the students for the use of ICT halls. There are 60 computers, 5 LCD Projectors.

Other Infrastructure:

1. The entire campus has been made Wi-Fi enabled.

Library automation process has been started from the year 2009 with “SOUL 2.0” Integrated Library Management System maintained in local server. This LMS consists of Acquisition, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serial control, Stock Verification, User Management, Reports, OPAC modules etc. Total 04 computers are used in the library management process.

Software of University Libraries (SOUL) is a state-of-the-art integrated Library Management Software designed and developed by the INFLIBNET Centre based on requirements of college and University Libraries. It is user-friendly software developed under client-server environment. The software is compliant to international standards for bibliographic formats, networking and circulation protocols.

Acquisition module enables library staff to handle all the major function, such as suggestions management, order processing, cancellation & reminders, receipt, payment and budgetary control, master files such as currency, vendors, publishers and reports.

Catalogue module is used for retrospective conversion of library resources. It has a facility to process the newly acquired library resources. The strong features of catalogue module allow cataloguers to create their own templates for data entry of different library resources. It allows User generated customized reports, facilitates authority database of person name, corporate body, and subject headings and series name.

Circulation module takes care of all possible functions of circulation. Sufficient care has been taken in designing this module starting from membership management, maintenance and status of library items, transaction, overdue charges, renewals and reminders, search status and report generation according to the status of the items.

Serials control managing is the most complicated job for a library. The Module keeps track of serials in the library efficiently. Administration module of the SOUL 2.0 functions as per inputs from the various SOUL users and requirements of the library staff.

Technological Infrastructure available for Library Management

- Library OPAC is available for searching books available in the library.
- Barcode Technology is applied in library, all books and membership cards are barcoded.
- Issue return transactions are done with barcode enabled devices.
- CCTV Surveillance System is available in the library for security purposes.

- 1 KV power Inverter is installed to support library electricity needs for 24x7.

The college provides computer facilities to the students to learn experimentally and also to gain access to cutting-edge technologies in the IT world. These systems have excellent networking facilities with additional Wi-Fi routers in each block.

The IT facilities that are available in supporting academic and non-academic activities include:

- 2) Wi-Fi Internet throughout the campus.
- 3) All desktop computers are connected to Campus Network.
- 4) Laser Printers are provided in major departments.
- 5) Desktop computers & LCD projectors are available in all smart rooms.
- 6) Curriculum-based software's are regularly updated based on the need in every semester.
- 7) All the latest software's are regularly updated to keep in pace with development.
- 8) All laboratories are equipped with LCD projectors.
- 9) All computer systems are connected to an Uninterrupted Power Supply.

There are 60 computers being used at college. Each department has computers with internet connectivity.

There are full-fledged computer labs at the Department of Commerce, Dept. of Computer Science, Language Laboratory, and Library, etc.

The staff members have been provided with internet facilities in all departments.

The college has broadband with 50Mbps BSNL / RailTel lease line connectivity.

The department of Computer Science offers access to internet browsing for students on its first floor. The IQAC, administration and account sections, Exam section, etc. have internet connectivity. Limited Wi-Fi facility for students to access e-books and video lectures.

Due to COVID-19 Pandemic, from March 2020 onwards the teaching adversely affected for three months, but the IQAC formulated the Anti-Corona Policy and implemented it with effect from June 2020. A Committee for Online Teaching was formulated.

Almost 100% teachers started with Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Meet etc. The Online Teaching Committee created Whats App groups of all the college students class-wise. Daily online class link was shared to the students. The weekly report of the online teaching was submitted to the IQAC through the HoDs. This practice helped to bring back on the track the teaching-learning activities during COVID-19. The IQAC Coordinator designed an **LMS website** for college to introduce online teaching.

The college has upgraded its official website from time to time. Now the website is dynamic and disabled friendly. The website is maintained regularly for communicating relevant information to students and concerned authorities.

Administrative setup:

The Kinwat Shikshan Sanstha is at the topmost tier in the organizational structure of the institution. It supervises the overall functioning of the institution and directs the Principal whenever necessary. IQAC informs the head of the institution of the requirements regarding infrastructure, facility of laboratories, upgradation of classrooms, and augmentation of various facilities for students. Thereafter the head of the institution presents this proposal in CDC meetings. After considering the necessity of requirements, the CDC and the executive body approved them.

The College Development Committee (CDC) is constituted as per the norms laid down by the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (which was earlier known as the Local Managing Committee). Preparing budget and financial statements, recommending the creation of teaching and non-teaching posts to the Management, discussing academic and other progress of the college are the primary functions of the CDC.

The institutional decisions are made by the head of the institution in consultation with management and then it is conveyed to faculty and various committee/cell in-charges. The Principal monitors the

functioning of every committee. The smooth conduction of all the committees is ensured by him. Various institutional and departmental level committees are constituted for discussing the issues and take decisions.

Appointment and service rules, procedures:

The Institution is affiliated to the SRTMU, Nanded, and is governed as per the norms laid down by the UGC and the Maharashtra Universities Act. 2016. The College is permanently affiliated to SRTMU, Nanded. It is mandatory for the institution to observe and follow the rules and regulations of the SRTM University, Nanded.

The institution strictly follows the statutory norms and procedures in the recruitment and promotion of academic and administrative staff. The recruitment and promotional policies are designed by the UGC and the Government of Maharashtra. It is binding for the college to abide by them. For recruitment, the institution gives advertisement in at least one National Level Newspaper and one Local Newspaper.

Interviews of eligible candidates are conducted by the duly constituted selection committees after the due date of submitting applications notified in the advertisement is over. The selection of the candidate depends on their merit basis. Similarly, the existing norms of UGC are followed at the time of granting promotion to employees.
